RE: Title I- Low-Income Data Survey

DATE: February 14, 2019

The need to identify every single low-income child in our schools has become a challenging task that falls upon all of our principals, not just those in Title I schools. This Low-Income Data Survey will affect every school even if the school does not presently participate in Title I. The local public school district in which your school resides will be seeking this data from you to report to federal and state agencies.

For elementary parochial and private schools, special education schools, and diocesan high schools located in school districts outside Philadelphia, the principal has the responsibility for reporting low-income data to the individual school districts. The enclosed survey and record form will be helpful in this process. We are recommending that you offer the survey to every school family this year and make a concerted effort to obtain this data.

- If you choose, you may use the enclosed cover letter to accompany the survey.
- Each survey should have a code number which corresponds to a particular family to provide confidentiality. Please number the surveys prior to their distribution.
- Add the return date to the survey.

The complete survey forms are confidential information and should be retained in your school for the next six years. They are not to be submitted to anyone except the proper authority from the local public school district seeking this information in writing.

On the return form to the local public school districts, addresses, not names, of low-income children identified through this process must be provided so we can continue to receive our fair share of federal dollars and other benefits. The number you assign to each family on the survey form becomes the student number on the reporting form. If there is more than one student in a family, you may designate students by adding an alphabetical or numerical code after the family number. A sample reporting form which you may use is enclosed. Please note that a YES in any blank under Section A qualifies the children in the low-income status. In addition, if your school participates in the Federal Hot Lunch Program, any student who receives a free or reduced hot lunch qualifies in the low-income status. Children in Pre-K are not included in this survey.

Each school is asked to compile this information and be prepared to submit these forms upon written request from the local public school district by mid-March, 2019. If you do not hear from the local public school district requesting this information by April 5, 2019, please contact me.
