- Students who do not own an instrument are responsible for renting or purchasing an instrument. Instrument rentals will be made available through Zeswitz. Students will be measured for their appropriate size instrument at school.

St. Helena's Orchestra Program Contract

- 1. Group string instrument lessons are provided during the school day for students grade 2-8.
- 2. Each lesson is 30 minutes long. They are held once a week on a rotating schedule so that students do not miss the same class each week.
- 3. Students must enroll (in advance) for 4 months of lessons at a time October through January February through May. Group lesson tuition for a four month period is \$250. Checks should be made payable to "Andrew Hoy." There is no refund for the four month lesson period and no make-up lessons. Special payment arrangements may be made with Mr. Hoy. Please direct any questions to Andrew Hoy, at andrewhoy@amblermusicacademy.com.
- 4. If a student forgets their instrument or book, they will still be expected to participate in the lesson. Parents will be contacted when students are forgetting their instruments on a regular basis. If a student forgets their assigned lesson time, the lesson will not be made up. Students may arrive 5 minutes prior to their lesson time to prepare their instrument.
- 5. All fees are due two weeks prior to the first lesson of the semester (September 20 and January 20).
- 6. It is imperative that the student practice for their weekly lesson at home if they expect to make satisfactory progress on their instrument. It is also important that the student is on time for their music lesson. It is up to the student to make arrangements with their classroom teacher to make-up any class work when attending their music lesson.
- 7. An instrument rental program will be available to students. A beginner's four month trial period (at a reasonable cost) will be made available. At the end of the four month trial period, students may then rent (or buy) the instrument on a monthly basis or return the instrument at no additional cost.
